


YEAR 5 & 6 FOOTBALL


Wonder is a funny, astonishingly moving book to read in one sitting, pass on to others, and remember long after the final page.

Recipe



Gingerbread

Ingredients:

- . 350g plain flour, plus extra for rolling out
- . 1 tsp bicarb
- . 2 tsp ground ginger
- . 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- . 125g butter
- . 175g light soft brown sugar
- . 1 free-range egg
- . 4 tbsp. golden syrup



For the decoration: Writing icing (optional), Sprinkles (optional)

Method:

Sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon and pour into the bowl of a food processor. Add the butter and blend until the mix looks like breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar.

Lightly beat the egg and golden syrup together, add to the food processor and pulse until the mixture clumps together. Tip the dough out, knead briefly until smooth, wrap in cling film and leave to chill in the fridge for 15 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Line two baking trays with greaseproof paper.

Roll the dough out to a 0.5cm thickness on a lightly floured surface. Using cutters cut out the gingerbread men shapes and place on the baking tray, leaving a gap between them.

Bake for 12-15 minutes, or until lightly golden-brown. Leave on the tray for 10 minutes and then move to a wire rack to finish cooling. When cooled decorate with the writing icing and sprinkles, if using.

- · Two sheets of Brown card
- Two Googly eyes
- One Red pompom
- Scissors(adults supervision required)
- PVA glue
- Black pen
- Sellotape




- 1. Wrap the brown card around your head and put some sticky tape to hold it in place.
- 2. Cut out two antlers and stick them opposite each other with your sticky tape.
- 3. Stick the googly eyes on the front using your PVA glue leaving space for your red pompom in between them.
- 4. Then draw a smile for the mouth almost at the bottom between the eyes.
- 5. Stick the pompom between the mouth and eyes.

Then you will have your very own Rudolph hat!
